

## Route D: Tynninghame to Binning Wood



Start at point D1 at the junction of the Main Street of Tynninghame and the A198. Walk northwards along the grass strip to the left of the A198. Just beyond the last building on the left is a wooden farm gate on your left at point D2. Go through this gate and close it behind you. You are in a grassy field and can see a beech hedge running along its northern boundary.

Walk north towards a large gap in this hedge, which is about 50 metres long, from right to left. There is a stretch of fencing across this gap which is not barbed wire and is easy to pass over into the arable crop field to the north of the hedge at D3. Once you are in this field, walk westwards along the beech hedge on the field's southern boundary for about 100 metres, keeping to the edge of the field and taking care not to damage any growing crops. At the end of the hedge you reach point D4.

Now turn right and walk northwards along the western edge of the field, taking care not to damage any growing crops.

After about 220 metres, the field edge bends left and then immediately right again. Continue to follow it towards the north for a further 200 metres. You will reach a minor roadway at D5. This road connects Lawhead with the A198 and there is little traffic on it. Cross the road with care. On the other side of it is a belt of woodland with a well-established track running along its centre. Walk up this track, continuing northward. After 450 metres, you reach the end of the track at point D6, which is the junction of Route D with tracks running around the margin of Binning Wood (red routes

on the map). After walking in and around Binning Wood on these tracks, you could return to Tynningame by the same route.
