

Tyninghame Village tree locations: a short stroll with bark and leaf rubbing opportunities. Please remember to socially distance. What you will need: Some thin paper: some coloured crayons:

Method:

- Select a suitable tree with good patterned bark, please do not dislodge bark as this can damage tree and affect insects living there.
- Hold the paper up against the tree bark and gently rub the crayon over the surface using the long side is best. Try overlapping with different colours
- Collect some fallen leaves from the tree and use to create leaf rubbings as well.
- Use your creative side to make a collage from your rubbings.
- You could then compare the patterns made and also learn how to identify the trees.
